SYNOD - DISTRICT FINANCES

2010 GOAL PERFORMANCE

Annually in the Fall, contribution goals are suggested to congregations for the SELC District budget. Increases are not based on communicant memberships. They are calculated on the basis of a percentage increase of a congregational goal accepted by a congregation for the previous year. The suggested increase for 2010 was only +1%.

7 increased above the suggested +1%

12 increased +1%

1 new congregation (Hope, Melbourne, FL)

10 reported the same goals as 2009

14 decreased goals

44 congregations reported

9 did not report (goals remained the same)

53 congregations

Decrease \$27,293 Increase 5,097 Negative \$22,196

PROJECTED GOAL RECEIPTS

Congregational budget receipts for seven months (8/31/10) were \$334,217. Hopefully this good performance rate will translate into \$559,963 for the year at 103.37%. However, only a +1% increase was suggested for 2010 compared to +5% increases in pre-recession years. A 2010 budget deficit of \$148,337 is projected. Extra contributions above accepted goals will help deflate the deficit.

Mother Teresa is well-known for the loving care she bestowed on the poor, hungry, sick, disabled, and dying people of India. "I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me drink, I was a stranger and you took me in, I was naked and you clothed me, I was sick . . ." (Matt. 25:35-36)

Mother Teresa served people because she saw each one as Jesus himself. If she fed a person, she was feeding Jesus. She loved Jesus so purely and completely and believed so strongly that loving and helping any person is loving and serving Jesus that she had to help all in need, especially the outcasts of society. She visited those who had leprosy and tuberculosis. She picked up hungry, diseased, sick, dying people from the streets and cleaned their bodies, removed worms, fed them and showed them that she cared. She gave them human dignity and love. She writes of the joy that it always gave her to see smiles from a person who felt wanted and loved by her care through her love for Jesus.
