The next convention of the Lutheran Church - Missouri Synod will be held this year, July, 2010, in Texas. Those representing our Western Circuit will be:



"Hosanna, Loud Hosanna"

On Palm Sunday, many congregations sing a hymn written for children but loved by adults, too. Jeanette Threlfall, an Englishwoman, composed "Hosanna, Loud Hosanna" in 1873.

Threlfall's parents died when she was still very young, so she was sent from one relative to another. She also had two serious accidents during childhood, leaving her disabled.

Threlfall handled her difficulties by developing a beautiful, cheerful character. She was more concerned about others than herself. People loved to visit her because they left feeling uplifted and joyous. Threlfall became known for her sacred poems and hymns. Many are considered classics, filled with sound doctrine and fervent devotion.

Here is the first stanza of her Palm Sunday anthem:

Hosanna, loud hosanna, the little children sang; Through pillared court and temple the lovely anthem rang. To Jesus, who had blessed them close folded to his breast, The children sang their praises, the simplest and the best.

What is faith?

"Sight is not faith, and hearing is not faith, neither is feeling faith; but believing when we neither see, hear nor feel is faith; and everywhere the Bible tells us our salvation is to be by faith. Therefore we must believe before we feel, and often against our feelings, if we would honor God by our faith."

REPORT ON ZION WOMEN'S GUILD MEETING FEBRUARY 16, 2010

Nine members and one guest gathered at noon for good fellowship and food. Bess Cerny, Keith Lencho and Anne Peck supplied us with delicious homemade sausages, potato salad, chicken salad, Jell-o and desserts which everyone enjoyed.

At 1:10 PM Edith Constien led the group in devotions from the LWML Quarterly entitled, "Who Am I? Whose Am I?" During lunch the ladies had written a couple things about themselves on bits of paper. These were read, one by one, by Edith while the members tried to guess who wrote it. Everyone had fun doing this, and learned a bit about others they didn't know before. This led into the devotion which identified us all as: Created by God in His image, but now weak and sinful; forgiven by God's grace, called to spread the Gospel message and called to serve by following Jesus' example.

Marlee Johns and the Guild members want to **thank Eleanor and John Kachmarik** for their many years of ordering and delivering Christmas poinsettias and Easter lilies. Your faithful service was greatly appreciated. Virginia reported that at the **District Convention will be held here on May 14-16**. The theme for the Convention is: "But for me and my house, we will serve the Lord." The District is hoping there will be 50 people in attendance. They will be here at Zion for luncheon and registration on Friday morning, May 14.

Virginia said that **Carson's is having another Community Day Sale**, and they contacted her to sell coupon booklets for that sale. The booklet contains a \$10 coupon, plus other discounts for the shoppers. The **booklets sell for \$5 each**, which money is kept by the society. Last year Virginia sold 31 books and donated \$155 to Zion for the new roof. Mary Mark and Marlee offered to sell the books this year, and the money earned will again be donated to the New Roof Fund.

Marlee read a thank you letter from the Lutheran Mission in Haiti, and showed a picture of Pastor Isaacs and his wife and the 24 children they have adopted. Our donation helps support four schools, pays the teachers, and provides the rice and beans which is often the children's only meal for the day. It was voted to send \$100 from our Birthday/Anniversary Fund to this Mission. Since the earthquake in Haiti, many hungry people have been coming to Pastor Isaac for food.

Pastor Bajus reported that **Project Hope's Pasta Dinner** will be held at Zoar Lutheran Church on Saturday, March 20, from 5-6 PM. There will be an accordion player and a sing-along also.

Marlee told us about "Angel Food Ministries" which is similar to Market Days, but which benefits the church, as Market Days does the schools. Marlee ordered food from Bethlehem Lutheran Church and will let us know how it is, and will report next month.

Mary Fickenscher, Vice President, and Edith Constien, Secretary, were then re-installed in their offices by Pastor Bajus. The meeting adjourned at 2:35 PM with the Lord's Prayer and blessing.

Julie reviewed her minutes from our last meeting.


Sharron Schademann presented her Treasurer's Report.

DIRT


Make this easy snack for your family or your friends at Sunday school. As you eat it, celebrate the miracles God brings in the spring.

- 2 cups milk
- 1 (4-serving size) box of chocolate instant pudding
- 1 (8 oz.) tub of frozen whipped topping, thawed
- 1 (16 oz.) package Oreo cookies, crushed
- 8-(9 oz.) plastic cups
- · gummy worms and frogs.
- plastic flowers (optional)

What you do:

- Mix milk and pudding in a large bowl. Beat with a whisk until well blended. Let stand 5 minutes.
- 2. Add whipped topping and half of the crushed Oreos.
- Place 1 tablespoon crushed Oreos in each cup. Fill cups ³/₄ full with pudding.
- 4. Top with remaining crushed Oreos.
- Chill at least 1 hour or until ready to serve.
- 6. Decorate with gummy worms and/or frogs.
- Place the stem end of the plastic flower into the center of the pudding dessert.
