Married to Mohammed - Part II

I think it is both telling and alarming that so many young people in our Lutheran churches are dating and marrying Muslims. What should Christian parents be doing to prevent this? It clearly must begin with teaching our children. We must teach our children when they are young about other religions. There is most .certainly a big difference between Islam and Christianity. One has a Savior. The other does not, One offers the beautiful gift of God's love. forgiveness and eternal life; The other offers only a vague hope that God will accept us one day. Islam is based on obeying laws; Being a Christian is based on God's love and grace that came through Him. Now we must do our job as parents to let our children know that. God's grace is priceless. This gift of Jesus, His death and resurrection to give us life with God forever is worth more than anything.



Having said that, we need to be practical in terms of what will build our children up in the faith to make them strong enough to make the right decisions when it comes to a life partner.

Regular worship, and especially Bible study are crucial. Pastors may teach 100 verses from the pulpit, but an in-depth knowledge of the Scriptures will only come through Bible reading and Bible study. If our children enter high school, and especially college with a weak foundation, they are prime candidates to fall into all sorts of spiritual traps: secular humanism, "the belief-that all religions are the same, and the trap of falling in love with someone from another religious background. If we don't prepare them, the arguments that may confuse are predictable; "Islam is the same as Christianity." Or, "We believe in Jesus too." Or "Islam is superior to Christianity." Young people see this synergistic faith where you can earn your way to heaven by what you do, and they somehow find it attractive. They see people wearing white tunics or scarves. They see people openly fasting and praying with beads in hand and they are drawn in. If they've not been taught to personally value the Gospel, they may gravitate towards the law. They don't realize these people are the "whitewashed-tombs" Christ spoke about "clean on the outside, but inside full of rottenness."

There is one practice all of us can adopt that will imprint on our children's minds that marrying a believer is important, and that the Lord has the power to orchestrate that. That one thing, of course, is to pray. Start the practice now of praying for your child's future spouse. Pray for a godly believer for your son or daughter; we know God hears our prayers. Praying for this in your children's presence will also enlighten them: "Oh, so God cares and can work in this area of my life too?"



The starting date will either be Sunday or Monday evening, start and run for five consecutive evenings, 6:30-8:30 p.m.





Lamb Mission Bank


God can do great things with our gifts. This craft reminds us that every little coin counts. When your lamb is full, empty out the coins and give them to a charity or church mission program.

What you need:

- Knit glove (black or white)
- 1-foot-long piece of thin ribbon, any color
- Stapler
- Craft glue or hot glue gun
- · Fiberfill or cotton balls
- · 2 googly eyes

What you do:

- 1. Staple one end of the ribbon to the inside of each side of the glove's opening to make a hanger.
- 2. For the lamb's body, cover the palm and half of the thumb with glue. Stick the fiberfill or cotton balls onto the glue.
- 3. Glue a googly eye to each side of the mitten's thumb. (The other fingers will be the legs.)
- 4. Hang the lamb where you'll see it often. Whenever you have extra change, drop it into your lamb bag.
