BROTHERLY LOVE

This story is told by a Methodist Bishop about two brothers, whom he knew. One brother was a physician and the other was a new car dealer... an Oldsmobile dealer. (Oldsmobiles are no longer in production.)

It was the custom of the car dealer to give his brother a new car every year when the new cars came out. The year-old car was then sold and the new one driven by the doctor.

After one of the new cars had been delivered to the doctor, he went on a house call. (Not too many doctors make house calls today.) After he made the call, he came out of the house and noticed a little poorly-dressed boy, about 12, standing and admiring the new car.

The doctor asked, "Well, what do you think of it?" The boy was ecstatic. "Wow! Doc! It's really something! How much did it cost?"

The doc replied, "I really don't know. You see, it's a gift from my brother." Then he asked the boy, "Would you like to take a ride?"

"Boy would I," the lad exclaimed. So the little fellow was taken for a ride around a few blocks in the brand new car.

After the ride, he said to the doctor, "Could you wait here one more minute?" He ran into the house and returned carrying a little boy about half his age. It was his crippled brother. "Look at this, Jimmy! Ain't it a beauty. And you know something — his brother gave it to him."

The twelve year old paused for a moment and then added, "Jimmy, when I get to be a man, I'm going to be that kind of brother."

Generosity is a theme here for all three: the car dealer with the car, the doctor and his time with the lad, and the 12 year-old in his love for his brother. Scripture encourages us also. (1 Tim 6:18) "Command them to do good, to be rich in good deeds, and to be generous and willing to share."

In his short story "The Capital of the World," Ernest Hemingway writes of a young man named Paco who had been kicked out of his home. Paco was wandering Madrid's streets, hoping to become a bullfighter.

Paco's father, desperate to mend the rift between them, resorted to putting an ad in the local newspaper. It said, "Paco, meet me at the Hotel Montana at noon on Tuesday. All is forgiven!"

On Tuesday, 800 young men named Paco showed up at that hotel, longing for restoration and forgiveness.

Like Paco's dad, our heavenly Father takes the first step. He invites us prodigal sons and daughters to meet him at the empty tomb. God won't turn away or disappoint anyone. He offers total forgiveness, without conditions, to all.

Prayer's power

Great changes are the result of fervent prayer, as pastor and evangelist A.C. Dixon noted:

"The revival which we call the Reformation was born in prayer. [Martin] Luther's habit was to pray three hours a day. The knees of [Philipp] Melanchthon were found after his death to have been made callous[ed] by kneeling. Pentecost was preceded by 10 days of supplication and prayer. Peter and John were in the spirit of prayer on their way into the temple, when the other great revival in which many were converted was commenced. ... Oh, for Elijahs who can break up the spiritual drought by praying rain out of the skies!"

Quotes from Martin Luther

- "Faith, like light, should always be simple and unbending; while love, like warmth, should beam forth on every side and bend to every necessity of our brethren."
- "Faith is a living and unshakeable confidence, a belief in the grace of God so assured that a man would die a thousand deaths for its sake."

Pillars of the faith

Because Martin Luther nailed his 95 theses, or thoughts, to a church door in Wittenberg, Germany, on October 31, 1517, many Christians remember that day and the major changes, or Reformation, that resulted.

Luther's theses contained three main pillars, which have stood for almost 500 years:

- 1. Sola Scriptura (Scripture Alone) The Bible is the sole authority in matters of faith, life and conduct. "All scripture is inspired by God and is useful for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness" (2 Timothy 3:16, NRSV).
- 2. Sola Fide (Faith Alone) Christians are justified, or declared righteous, only through believing in Jesus Christ as Savior. Although morality and good works are important, they alone cannot lead to salvation. "A person is justified not by the works of the law but through faith in Jesus Christ" (Galatians 2:16, NRSV).
- 3. Sola Gratia (Grace Alone) Grace is God's unmerited, or undeserved, favor. Salvation is a free gift from our gracious God. "For by grace you have been saved through faith, and this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God not the result of works, so that no one may boast" (Ephesians 2:8-9, NRSV).



In addition to the Sunday morning Bible Class taught by Dr. Schipull in the Conference Room every Sunday morning, Pastor is planning an Adult Instruction Class in Christian Doctrine for those interested in Church Membership or for those who want to review Christian doctrine. Eight members and two guests gathered at noon for a delightful luncheon provided by Mary Mark and Eleanor Kachmarik. Eleanor requested that checks for Mites be made out to Zion Women's Guild. After all the Mites are collected she will send a check for the total amount to the Western Zone LWML.

Edie Constien reported that the LWML SELC Western Zone Fall Rally will be held at Resurrection Lutheran Church in Crown Point, Indiana on November 6.

The August Rummage Sale profits were split evenly between the Guild and Faithful Hearts & Hands. Thrivent will match up to \$1000 of the total. The Guild then decided that we would send our \$500 to Thrivent, and will then receive \$1,000 back. This money is to be used for charities and not kept for the church. Pastor Bajus suggested the Guild give part of the money for Military Outreach Kits (\$25 each) for audio New Testaments to be handed out to service personnel. The other charity chosen for a donation is the Haitian Lutheran Mission Project which is in dire need of medical supplies.

Nona Schipull reported that an organization called "Love Packages" collects Christian materials to send overseas. They will accept our bulletin inserts, Portals of Prayer, Bibles and religious books. Nona also reported that we should save our old linens for the St. Paul, Melrose Park, quilters. They need old sheets and blankets for the filling in the quilts they make for Lutheran World Relief. You may bring these items to the Ushers' Room.

There will be an Executive Board meeting to make out the year's calendar on October 8 at church at 9:30 AM.

Marlee reported that the dishwasher was repaired and all parts were under warranty, so there was no cost. The dishwasher will be left unplugged when not in use to prevent further power surges.

Martha Durica has volunteered to be the hostess for the October 12 meeting, and Nona Schipull and Bess Cerny volunteered to host the February 8th meeting. Nona stated she would be coming to the Guild meetings regularly as a liaison from Faithful Hearts and Hands.

Devotions were then led by Pastor Bajus. We began by singing "Renew Me, O Eternal Light" and prayer. The devotion was from the LWML Quarterly titled "The Pressure's Off: A Better You." Contrary to having a physical "make-over" of hair and make-up, the Christian life is not a do-it-yourself project; it is a walk of faith. We receive much comfort from knowing that the power for the Christian life comes from the Holy Spirit and even our faith is a gift from God. How can you draw upon the power of the Spirit in the week ahead?

Sharron Schademann presented her Treasurer's Report.



We determined that Lutheran Church Charities-Disaster Relief, postage costs to mail school supplies to Tanzania, and Lutherbrook would be the recipients of our donations.

Love Packages, a ministry aimed at putting Christian literature and Bibles into the hands of people around the world, will take our bulletin inserts, in addition to other print items, such as Portals of Prayer and Christian books. We will devise a system for collecting those inserts. Nona and Doug Schipull recently visited the Love Packages facility in Butler, Illinois, and were most impressed by what they saw.

LWML Sunday will be observed in October. Members of our group have volunteered to serve as readers and ushers. The Western Zone Fall Rally will be November 6^{th} at Resurrection (Indiana).

Clean old sheets, curtains, etc., are needed by the quilting circle at St. Paul, Melrose Park, to make quilts which are donated to Lutherbrook and Lutheran World Relief.

A TASTE OF GRACE

Because Jesus died and rose for us, we have the free gifts of forgiveness and eternal life. That's the meaning of grace: "God's Riches At Christ's Expense."


Celebrate God's grace by "spelling it out" with this fun, nutritious recipe.

What you need:

- An adult to help
- 2 bowls
- Mixing spoon
- 1 Tablespoon yeast
- 1/2 cup warm water
- 1 teaspoon honey
- 11/3 cup flour
- 1 teaspoon salt
- Cutting board
- Cookie sheet

What you do:

- 1. Preheat the oven to 325 degrees.
- 2. In a small bowl, stir the yeast with the water and honey. Let the mixture sit for five minutes.
- 3. In another bowl, stir the flour and salt together.
- 4. After five minutes, add the bubbly yeast mixture to the flour and salt mixture.
- 5. Stir everything together, first with a spoon and then with your hands. The dough is ready when it's still a little crumbly.
- 6. Put the dough on a cutting board with a little flour. Knead it into one big ball.
- 7. Divide the dough into 12 pieces, and roll each piece into a snake shape.
- 8. Form the letters GRACE (twice). Then form the two extra pieces into any shape you choose.
- 9. Bake your letters and shapes on the cookie sheet for about 10 minutes. Let cool, and enjoy!
