- Would I like to help others know what Christ offers believers?
- How am I making "telling the good news" compatible with my own Christian lifestyle?

Concern for the Marginalized

- Do I personally engage regularly in some form of Christian service for the needy?
- Have I shaped my personal behavior and political convictions according to Matthew 25?
- What group outside the church in my own community is most in need of my help?

Stewardship

- Am I living within my income? Paying my bills on time?
- Is tithing a joy for me? A burden? Not part of my Christian practice?
- Do I really believe that God takes care of responsible and generous Christians' material needs?




As we are planning a fall church cleanup, Sharron will investigate the purchase of an Oreck vacuum cleaner for the church.

Fall Church Cleanup

Recycling Christian Materials for Gospel Outreach

Food Pantry Collection with Thrivent Matching Funds

- 2. Write down the time that you spent in going to the store, shopping, and bringing items to the church. Round to the nearest hour and record the time on the grocery store receipt. We receive money for the time we spend on our food pantry project.
- 3. We will total the food costs and the volunteer time for the project. Thrivent will pay the money to Zion. This is an easy way to raise funds for Zion by doing something that we would be doing anyway just some record keeping with grocery receipts and time spent Pray that God will bless us in our food pantry collection
