The story is told of an aged Indian, who spent much of his later years begging for food, clothing and shelter. One thing that attracted the attention of most people was an old piece of string around his neck, with a small pouch attached.

One day some inquisitive people, who had befriended him, asked what the pouch contained. The aged Indian opened the pouch and withdrew from it an old tattered blood stained piece of paper. It was his discharge from the service in the Federal Army, a piece of paper which assured him that the government would care for him, support him, and provide a place for him to live as long as he lived.

Just unbelievable! Here was a man who had the assurance of government care attached around his neck. He was unaware of what was guaranteed to him.

There are many within the Church who will enter the new year unaware of the assurances God has given already in the waters of Baptism. Some are filled with fear and anxiety. Others are uncertain about their future. If they could only have just some assurance, some security for the future, they would be content. They need a word of assurance to lean on, depend on.

Yet, we Christians, do have assurances from our God. We need only remember and recall them. The terrible consequence was More's beheading. In 1535, just before the sharp blade fell on his neck, More proclaimed, "The king's good servant, but God's first."




After barely surviving an overdose, Thomas returned home to discover his wife had become a Christian. After giving his life to Christ, Thomas felt incredible peace and



From humble beginnings

In 1804, William, a 21-year-old from a poor family, decided to go to New York City to find a job. He told a neighbor his plans, saying he knew how to make soap and might work in a soap factory.

The neighbor said, "Just remember to be a good man, give your heart to Christ and pay the Lord all that belongs to him. Give a dime of every dollar you make, make an honest soap and you will be a happy and wealthy man."

Sure enough, William found a job making soap. Later, he became part owner and then sole owner of the business. His product line — and giving — expanded greatly. He gave many millions of dollars to the Lord's work throughout the world, far more than 10 percent of his wealth.

William Colgate died in 1857 at age 74, but his legacy and company, Colgate-Palmolive, still thrive.

Hi from Chiang Mai!


Two weeks ago we traveled with Lahu friends to a village to join with Lahu believers in a Thanksgiving celebration they called "Offering the First fruits" and "Eating the First Rice". (As you see from the picture we ate more than rice!) Harvest is in full swing in this region. Tim was asked to give a Thanksgiving message as part of the worship service and he shared from Psalm 107, a reminder through David of how we can confidently depend on God for all that we need. The 'chorus' in this psalm is "...give thanks to the Lord for His unfailing love." We have a Father who keeps careful watch over our lives, and we can trust in his care.

You are part of God's provision for us in seeing him bring encouragement, new skills, and a deeper understanding of His powerful Word to people in Southeast Asia. We've received reports that 'Z' literacy teachers are using their new teaching materials successfully. Also, at the recent workshop on 'Developing Bible Studies' that Tim led, church leaders from six language groups created Bible study booklets and other materials to use in their communities and address pertinent issues in their lives. Thank you for your prayers and support for these things!



Your gifts also helped bring eight Z' friends to the Culture Meets Scripture workshop held in Chiang Mai in October. 

What's important

On February 4, 1968, exactly two months before Martin Luther King Jr. was assassinated, he delivered his last sermon at Atlanta's Ebenezer Baptist Church. In it, he described his preferences for his own funeral. He didn't want people to mention his Nobel Peace Prize, his other awards or where he went to school; none of that was important, he said. Instead, he wanted his eulogist to say that King "tried to give his life serving others" and "tried to love somebody."

In that sermon, King also said "everybody can serve," regardless of background or educational level. The only requirements, he said, were "a heart full of grace" and "a soul generated by love."

Determining God's will

Sometimes we're in a quandary about God's plan for our lives. For example, one young man felt led to enter the forestry service because God needs people to protect and care for his creation.

The man worked in a forest for six months and was fascinated by nature's beauty. But he was dreadfully lonely. Only as he worshiped with others on Sundays did he feel at ease. When the man enrolled in a seminary, he immediately found his comfort zone. Today he's a minister and loves serving God through the church.

LIGHT


Everyone who believes in God and lives for him is a child of light. Make this cover for your bedroom light switch to remind you to be a light for God.

What you need:

- An adult to help
- Light switch cover
- Screwdriver
- Colored paper
- Markers
- Scissors
- Decoupage glue
- Paintbrush
- Craft knife

What you do:

- 1. Remove the screws from the cover.
- 2. On the paper, draw small images related to light and write out "Live as children of light" (Ephesians 5:8, NIV).
- Cut out the drawings and verse. Make sure they'll fit on the cover.
- 4. Paint the cover with a coat of decoupage glue, and then immediately place the drawings and verse on the cover.
- 5. Paint over them with another coat of glue. Let it dry.
- 6. Turn the cover over and use a craft knife to cut out the opening for the light switch.
- Using a screwdriver, place your new light switch cover on your wall.


