Lori Wilbert

Continuing with special speakers during her 100th Anniversary Year, Deaconess Lori Wilbert came to Zion to speak on the subject of "Ministry to the Incarcerated."

It was in 1986 that Lori started for the NID -Northern Illinois District, in correctional and nursing home capacities.

He was also the liaison between the district and the State of Illinois regarding issues of homelessness, prison and welfare reform.

In the late 80's and through 1999, Lori served as the chaplain at the Sheridan Correction Center, Kankakee Minimum Security Center in Joliet.

Presently, Lori serves only Statesville Correction Center in Joliet.

Lori reminded us of the words of Jesus in Matthew 25:36-41

"I was in prison and you came to visit me.'....
When did we see you sick or in prison and go to visit you?' "The King will reply, 'I tell you the truth, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers of mine, you did for Me.""

Jr. Confirmation Class

Members of the Junior Confirmation Class met the first two weeks in August to continue their preparation for meaningful membership in the Church, including the reception of the blessed Sacrament of the Altar.

We began with the study of **Holy Baptism**, what it means and how important it is for our daily life.



LWML convention in Portland, OR Part 2

Saturday A.M. began with the "Mission in Motion" Mission Walk/Exercise. I chose to do the exercise program held in one of the convention halls. I had pledges from many members of Zion and several friends which totaled \$100.

The Fifth meeting began with the procession of past LWML presidents and prayer. The Young Women's Reps procession with the Heart to Heart Sisters from many nations all over the world was inspiring. There were 69 YWR's and 32 foreign reps. This followed with the singing of "Lutheran Women One and All" led by Dina Vendetti.

Bible Study #2 was led by Dr. Mary Hilgendorf. It was an indepth study of Judges 4 and 5 and Deborah -Prophetess, Wife, Judge, Warrior, Princess. The scene takes us to Mt. Tabor and the setting of the battle between the Israelites and the Canaanites. A very interesting study of the book of the Bible not well known to most Christians.

Convention Offering #3 was taken. \$27,842.29 was collected for the "Alaskan Mission for Christ."

Rev. Dr. Gerald Kieschnick, President of the Lutheran Church - Missouri Synod was the next speaker and greeted all the women present. He reminded us all of our goal and thanked us for the future goals of LWML.

The Sixth meeting, on Saturday afternoon began with the Mission Address. Rev. Dr. Thomas Zehnder, Executive Director of the LCMS World Mission was the speaker. Special missionary guests Michelle Hoeppner and Danielle Putnam were introduced. Michelle is a career missionary in Asia (Cambodia, India and China). Danielle is a missionary in the Dominican Republic.

Jan Struck aka Ruby Begonia of Or-e-gon, was the humorist throughout the convention. She was in disguise and would "pop up" many times during the convention. I had the pleasure of meeting Jan after her presentation, which she was herself.

The last voting of the convention was for "Officers." See attached page for the elected officers. Also attached are the Grants chosen for the 2009-11 biennium. Next on the agenda was the invitation/presentation for the 2011 LWML Convention to be held in Peoria, IL from June 23 - 26. The ladies of the Central Illinois District did a small skit on Lincoln and "Pennies from Heaven." The 2013 convention will be held in Pittsburgh, PA. In 2015, Des Moines, IA will host. At our Portland convention, it was announced that Salt Lake City, Utah will be the host for 2017.

Recognition was given to the Portland Host Committee and Districts for an outstanding job. Thousands of volunteers were presented in a parade. A standing ovation was given to our hosts.

Entertainment for the Seventh meeting on Saturday evening was "The Pride of Portland Chorus." An amazing group of women who sing in harmony and vary in age. They collected over \$300 among themselves to donate to LWML.

On Sunday morning, the Eighth meeting was held with a Worship Service. The Proclaimer was Rev. Carl Gnewuch, LWML Senior Pastoral Counselor. During this service, the newly elected officers were installed. Gifts from the Heart were dedicated. There were 308 health kits, 194 art kits, 697 packages of socks, 308 bears, 421 T-shirts and 1, 776 misc. items collected. The Sunday offering, (amount not reported) will go towards the LWML Endowment Fund.



The final total attendance for the convention was 3,310. The Portland convention was closed by our president Janice Wendorf.

I wish to thank the members of our LWML SELC Western Zone for the honor of being their delegate. I also want to thank the members of Zion for all your support and prayers before and after the convention.



Teaching giving

Now that Bill and his wife, Melinda, have traveled the world learning of the hurts, sickness and poverty of fellow humans, they work steadfastly to provide aid and hope. But you don't have to be a billionaire to give generously and cheerfully. What are some ways you can give — and, in doing so, teach others about giving?

GROWING UP FAST!

In September, Monarch butterflies migrate to warmer climates. In God's wonderful design, these butterflies have gone through an amazing transformation. This craft will remind you of the ongoing transformation that God has planned for you, too.

What you need:

- Clear, one-gallon zipper baggie (with no writing)
- Colored tissue paper
- Scissors
- Wooden, one-piece clothespin
- Pipe cleaner
- Black permanent marker
- Glue and wiggly eyes (optional)
- Magnet tape

What you do:

- 1. Turn the baggie inside out and rub it on your head to create static cling. Then turn the baggie right-side-out again.
- 2. Cut tissue paper into 2" x 2" squares.
- 3. Fill the baggie with tissue squares.
- 4. Press excess air out of the bag and zip it. Lay the baggie on its side (this will form the butterfly's wings) so the zipper is at the top.
- 5. Pinch the baggie with the clothespin so it divides the baggie into two equal parts to create the butterfly's head and body.
- 6. Thread the pipe cleaner through the hole atop the clothespin to form the antennae.
- With a permanent marker, write "Romans 12:2" on the bottom half of the clothespin.
- 8. Draw on eyes (or glue on wiggly eyes).
- Attach a strip of magnet tape to the back of the clothespin. Then display the butterfly on your refrigerator.




